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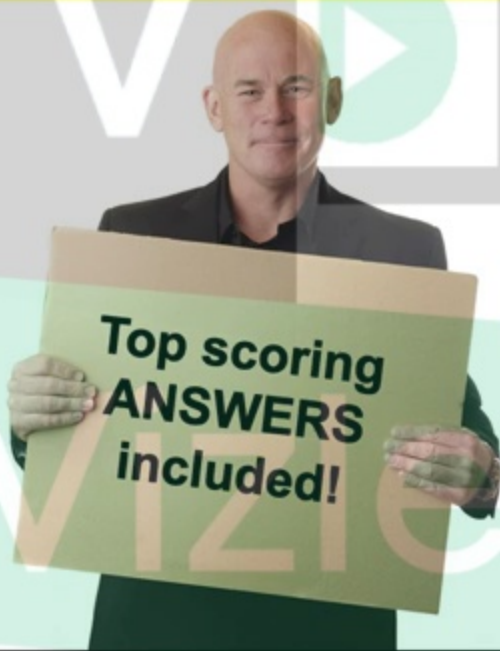

Q. Introduce yourself and tell me why we should hire you as a Lecturer?

Q. What's your teaching style as a Lecturer?
